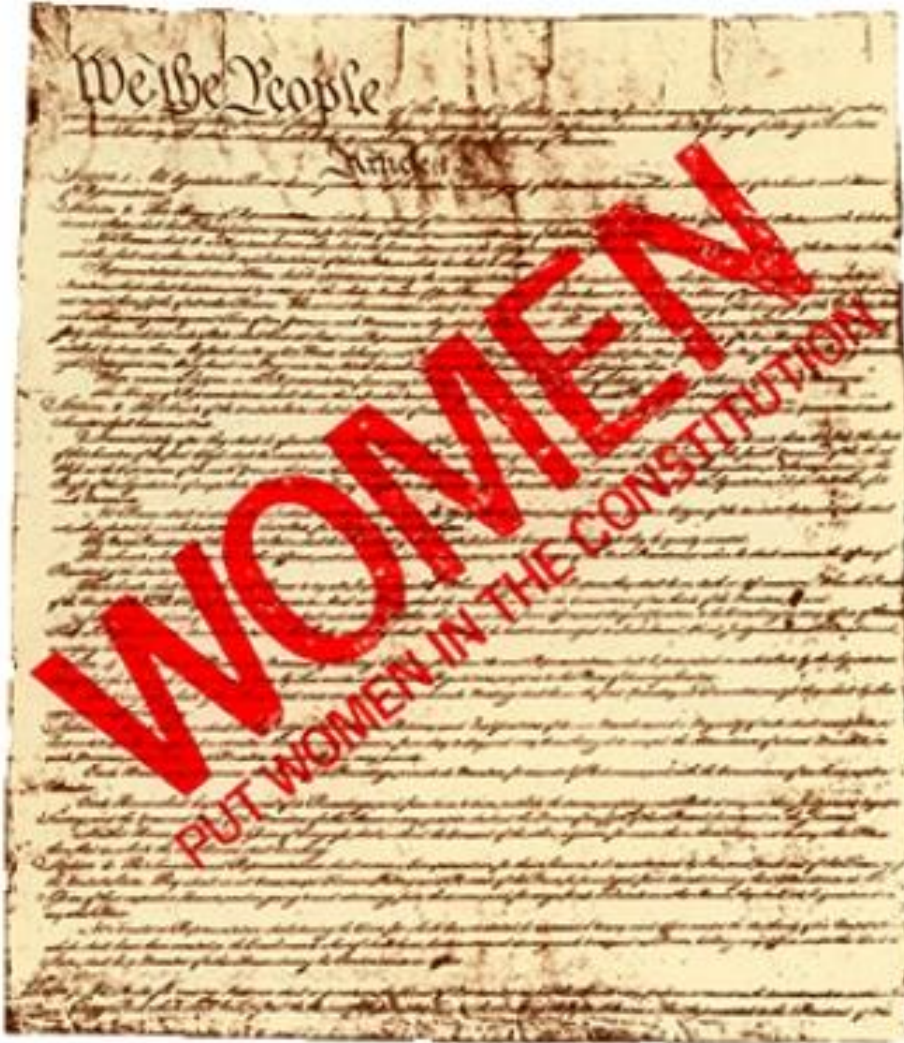


I'm not voting for Hillary, exclusively, for her ideas, but maybe even more for [another reason](#).
